FUCHSIA DESCRIPTIONS

Laura

Double, H2, Trailer (Martin, USA, 1968)

Tube; Red, medium length Red. Sepals; Red, long, broad, upturned.

Corolla; Sky Blue shading to Lavender, large blooms.

Foliage; Medium Green. Will make a good basket.

Blue Bush

Single, H3, Bush (Gadsby, UK, 1993)

Tube and Sepals; Rosy Red. Foliage; Mid to Dark Green.

Corolla; Bluebird Blue fading to Bishops Violet with Rosy veins. Medium sized blooms

Very vigorous upright growth. Maybe considered for hedges.

H1 Rather tender and frost shy. For perfection requires the winter protection of a heated greenhouse and temperatures in excess of 70 throughout the year.

H2 Described as half-hardy and may require some protection during winter.

H3 Described as hardy and can be planted permanently in the garden and will withstand normal winter conditions
